

USER GUIDE

Step 1

Fasten a line or rope to the finger slot as shown by the arrow. Fasten with a bow line knot (or similar) or by using a shackle. Don't forget to fasten and secure the other end of the rope.

Step 2

Offer up a suitable size boat hook or pole to the guide tube or use in hand.

Step 3

Insert boat hook (or pole), aligning the side hook with the guide Slot.

Step 4

Push the boat hook (or pole) into the guide tube, against latch mechanism to open gate by gripping talon and/or by pulling rope tight.

Step 5

Whilst gripping the rope and the boat hook (or pole) together hold the latch open and retain the talon on the end of the boat hook. The Talon is now ready to use, not forgetting to check the other end of the rope is secured.

Step 6

Once hooked onto desired location you can let go of the rope, pull boat hook out of guide tube to close the latch and recover boat Hook.

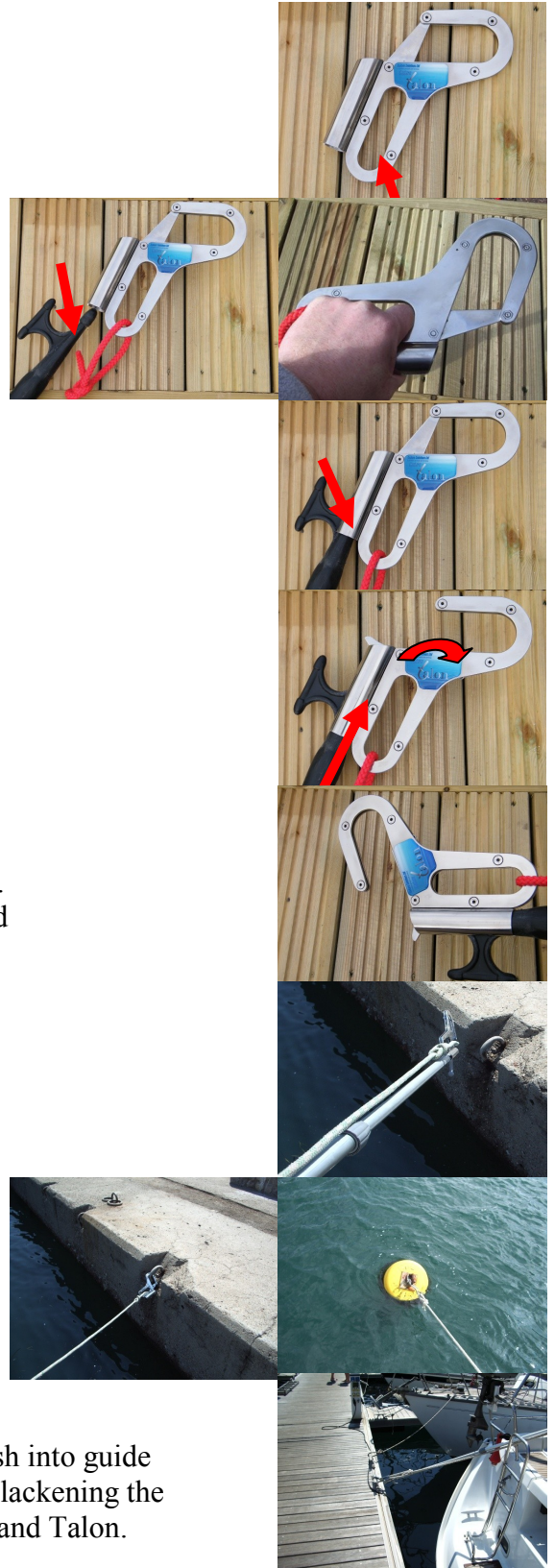
Step 7

Once the latch has closed, the Talon is secure. Ensure the other end of rope is secured to the vessel, adjust the length and tension as necessary.

Note: Talon is designed for short-term and attended mooring only. The vessel is not to be left secured on the Talon

To release

Holding the rope in one hand, offer up boat hook in other hand, push into guide Tube to open the latch. Gripping the boat hook and rope together, slackening the mooring line as necessary, unhook and recover both the boat hook and Talon.
